Greetings,

Here we are into March. Where did the winter go? Spring is here! I have a few reminders I'd like to share with you. First, I have received numerous complaints about some people's lack of respect for their neighbors by not securing their recyclables and allowing them to blow all over the streets and neighboring properties. I've written many times previously about this ongoing issue. How hard is it to flatten milk jugs, water bottles or most plastic receptacles? Newspapers and pizza boxes should be containerized as not to blow away and large stand up containers should have a lid.

Parking on the grass is prohibited. One wheel, two wheels or four wheels makes no difference. If you have more cars than you do parking spaces, it is your responsibility and not that of the Association. Letters and fines are applicable.

In accordance with Manchester's ordinance all mailboxes and homes shall be properly identified by the street address in $3\frac{1}{2} - 4\frac{1}{2}$ numbers plainly visible from the street. This is for the safety of all.

For the period July 1, 2022 through January 31, 2023 our finances continue to perform better than anticipated. Our operating income is \$262,490 which is \$130,377 better than budgeted. We have added \$239,167 this year to our reserve account, which will be used for long-term projects, like the paving project coming up. Our investments have generated \$21,294 income during this period!

Included in last month's chatter was an insurance coverage overview letter from JGS insurance. This is helpful information to make you aware that CV6 covers your home to a certain degree. This can lead to savings on your personal insurance premium. Please discuss with your insurance provider. Be on the lookout for the date JGS will come to our clubhouse to help us review our coverage.




