

Treasurer Report

Happy Easter!

The financial results reported in this chatter are for 8 months ending 2/29/24. Our Income for this period was \$1,400,856, which continues to be better than expected by \$17,552. In addition, our expenses of \$1,132,072 were \$7,896 lower than budgeted. Operationally, we have net Operating Income of \$268,785 which is \$25,449 higher than we expected. The good news is, after paying \$860,000 of our road project we still have \$1,053,554 in our investment account, with only \$540,000 due for the remainder of the road project.

We are getting hit hard with contract renewals that have steep increases. We are fighting, and negotiating diligently to keep our costs down for the upcoming year, but it's going to be very difficult to maintain our associations dues at the current level. But the battle is not lost, yet.

Our Pickleball group is one big happy family. We have about 16 regulars, from various neighborhoods, and we have encouraged other villages to host additional nights. Come out and see what all the fuss is about!
