Hello to all my fellow villagers. Here we are in May so let the bloom of May flowers bring you health and happiness. I'd like to say welcome to our new Trustee Carol Lauer. I thank her for stepping up and look forward to working with her.

I would like to bring to your attention the USPS address identification regulations. Every curbside mailbox must bear the following address information. A box number inscribed in contrasting color in neat letters and numbers at least 1 inch high on the side of the box visible to the carrier's regular approach or on the door if boxes are grouped. If the box is on a different street from the customer's residence the street name and house number must be inscribed on the box. The reason I bring this up is because I deliver the Chatter and out of the 88 homes on my route, 50 homes did not have numbers on their mailboxes, so, please, I urge all residents to check your mailboxes and affix numbers and letters where needed.(you can use the stick on numbers & letters from Lowes, Home Depot or any hardware store) If homeowners do not comply we, the B.O.T., will have to impose fines (which we do not want to do). I will thank you in advance for your help in achieving our goal to have all the mailboxes in our village make the USPS happy.

MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

DRYER VENT CLEANING

Spring is a good time to have your dryer vent cleaned. The cause of many house fires is clogged dryer vents. Dryer vents should be cleaned every year and is mandated by our insurance carrier. It does not matter if you live alone or a couple and it does not matter how many loads a week you do. What matters is that the moist lint that the drying process creates is to be blown out of the dryer, the vent lines, and the vent itself. Because it is moist lint, it tends to clump causing a blockage in the vent lines that can backup into the dryer itself. The length of the dryer vent lines in most models can be twenty-five feet or longer in length. That vent line should have a brush run through it to get rid of any debris or accumulation. That is why you need to have it cleaned annually for safety.

The Crestwood Village Six maintenance workers can do the dryer vent cleaning and inspection for you, at a minimal cost if you are not physically able to do it yourself or you can have it done by outside contractors.

Treasurer Report From Tom Perro

The financial results reported in this Chatter are for 9 months ending 3/31/24. Our Income for this period was \$1,573,717, which continues to be better than expected by \$17,500. In addition, our expenses of \$1,266,947 were \$15,517 lower than budgeted. Operationally, we have net Operating Income of \$306,770 which is \$33,017 higher than we expected. After we pay the balance of the roads project, we are expected to end the year with a balance of \$600,000 in our reserve account.

We are in the process of getting an updated Capital Reserve Study, which will establish a budgeted amount required to finance long term maintenance of our grounds and facilities.

Negotiating contracts for our village is ongoing, and we are holding our own to keep our costs down for the upcoming year. It appears that it will be very difficult to maintain our association dues at the current level.

Don't forget to register for the Senior Tax Freeze, PTR (Property Tax Reimbursement).

Brush and Bag Procedure

The Village provides removal of brush and bags for our residents. Paper bags are available in the office for purchase. Please take advantage of this awesome service. There are several guidelines for you to follow to make this as efficient as possible:

- Brush and bags must be out the night before or by no later than 6:30 AM the morning of Thursday's pickup;
- Raking and/or blowing the leaves to the curbs is NOT PERMITTED and will not be picked up the Village.
- There will be no return trips or doubling back for calls regarding missed pickups or late callers. There are 6 workers on the trucks doing the pickups and is highly unlikely that we are missing any piles or bags;
- Typically, there are 2-3 vehicles making the rounds, 1 dedicated for brush with a wood chipper in tow and 1 for bags;
- Brown paper recyclable lawn and leaf bags are the only types of bags permitted to be picked up and used for yard clean ups;
- These bags are for leaves, pine needles, acorns and pine cones only.

- The workers will leave your bags if there is evidence of improper materials stored; sticks, planters, excessive soil, rocks, etc. The intended materials are not heavy and should not make the bags heavy enough where the workers struggle to get them in the truck;
- These rules are promulgated by Manchester Township and they can revoke our dumping privileges if they are not abided by;
- Brush is to be left in neat piles by the curbside, on the lawn;
- The brush will be picked up and chipped up as we make our way;
- Excessively large piles of brush may not be picked up. If it appears that the brush piles were left by a subcontractor, a call will be placed to the resident, as it is pretty obvious when this occurs.
- No tree stumps of any kind are accepted.



DRYER VENT CLEANING


SAFETY PATROL
