Treasurer Report

From Tom Perro

Greetings!

Our financial results for the month of February are in. Our total income was \$191,558 which is higher than the budgeted amount of \$189,697 by \$1,861. Operating Expenses were \$153,237, which is \$4,320 lower than the budgeted amount of \$155,697.

After putting \$34,000 into our capital reserve accounts, we ended the month with a net profit of \$4,320. Which puts us at a profit of \$719 for the eight months of this current fiscal year. Our Capital Reserve Accounts have grown to \$819,677.

Operationally we have expenses of over \$100,000 due to the excessive snow plowing expenses we have incurred. This will be reported as a loss for the year, but I will not report it until year end. Although our insurance costs increased over 10% the amount budgeted for the year should be sufficient to cover the coverage.

We are resisting the need for a special assessment to cover the snow plowing expenses and take that money out of our reserve account.

We will be hosting a "Town Hall" meeting Saturday April 18th. This is a great opportunity to hear of our innovative ideas to enhance our village. Please try to come out and participate.

We are always striving to make Crestwood Village 6 a pleasant, safe, and happy place to live. Help us by attending our events and supporting our clubs and activities!

CRESTWOOD VILLAGE SIX ADVISORY BOARD MEETING MINUTES

Date: March 10, 2026

Location: Crestwood VI Clubhouse

Attendees: Advisory Board Members; Trustees Leo Ruscitto and Wayne Koester; President

1. Open Discussion - Winter Storm Aftermath

The meeting opened with extensive discussion regarding the recent winter storm, which produced **over two feet of snow**. Residents from multiple areas of the village submitted complaints about the storm response.

Key concerns included:

- **Three-day delay** in fully clearing the snow throughout the village.
- **Significant lawn damage** caused by plows digging into grass areas.
- **Heavy snow leading to widespread tree damage**, including broken branches and fallen limbs.

The Board acknowledged that while the storm was unprecedented in severity, residents felt the response could have been better coordinated.

2. Lawn and Property Damage

Residents reported numerous areas where plows tore up lawns and common-area grass.

- The **snow removal vendor has committed to repairing the damage** within the next several weeks.
- Residents experiencing damage were advised to **contact the HOA Main Office** to be added to the vendor's repair list.

3. Tree Damage and Branch Removal

Due to the weight of the snow, many trees suffered broken limbs.

- Residents should notify the **HOA Main Office** to be placed on the list for cleanup.
- The office will coordinate with the vendor to **remove or move large branches to the curb for bulk pickup scheduled for March 19, 2026.**

4. Safety Concerns - Clearing the Fingers and Main Roads

The Board discussed the importance of ensuring that all fingers and main streets are cleared promptly during storms.

- Failure to clear these areas poses a **serious safety risk**, as emergency vehicles (ambulance, fire trucks) may be unable to access homes.
- The Advisory Board emphasized the need for improved coordination to prevent delays in future storms.

5. Resident Compliance and Property Maintenance

Residents again raised concerns about property upkeep and compliance with community rules, including debris, exterior maintenance, and general appearance

- The Board discussed whether routine checks are being conducted and **who is responsible for monitoring compliance.**
- Clarification is needed on the process for identifying violations and ensuring follow-through.

6. Complaint Handling Process

The Board reviewed the current process for resident complaints.

- Questions were raised about who is responsible for addressing complaints once they are filled, and how follow-up is managed.
- The Advisory Board reiterated the need for a clear, consistent chain of responsibility.

7. Trustee Participation

Trustees **Leo Ruscitto** and **Wayne Koester** attended the meeting.

The Advisory Board presented resident concerns directly to the Trustees.

The Trustees acknowledged the issues and provided feedback on next steps.

8. Advisory Board Proposal Status

The Board asked for an update on the proposal previously submitted to the Trustees.

- The Trustees indicated that **part of the proposal has been approved**, with additional details to be provided.
- Further clarification is expected in the next issue of the **Deerfield Chatter**.

Adjournment

The meeting concluded with agreement to continue monitoring storm-related repairs, compliance concerns, and follow-up on the Advisory Board proposal.

LEAF & BRUSH PICKUP INSTRUCTIONS

Brush and Bag Procedure

The Village provides removal of brush and bags for our residents. Paper bags are available in the office for purchase. Please take advantage of this awesome service. There are several guidelines for you to follow to make this as efficient as possible:

- Brush and bags must be out the night before or by no later than 6:30 AM the morning of Thursday's pickup;
- Raking and/or blowing the leaves to the curbs is NOT PERMITTED and will not be picked up the Village.
- There will be no return trips or doubling back for calls regarding missed pickups or late callers. There are 6 workers on the trucks doing the pickups and is highly unlikely that we are missing any piles or bags;
- Typically, there are 2-3 vehicles making the rounds, 1 dedicated for brush with a wood chipper in tow and 1 for bags;
- Brown paper recyclable lawn and leaf bags are the only types of bags permitted to be picked up and used for yard clean ups;
- These bags are for leaves, pine needles, acorns and pine cones only.
- The workers will leave your bags if there is evidence of improper materials stored; sticks, planters, excessive soil, rocks, etc. The intended materials are not heavy and should not make the bags heavy enough where the workers struggle to get them in the truck;
- These rules are promulgated by Manchester Township and they can revoke our dumping privileges if they are not abided by;
- Brush is to be left in neat piles by the curbside, on the lawn;
- The brush will be picked up and chipped up as we make our way;
- Excessively large piles of brush may not be picked up. If it appears that the brush piles were left by a subcontractor, a call will be placed to the resident, as it is pretty obvious when this occurs.
- No tree stumps of any kind are accepted.

“No Cut” flags will be available in the Admin. Office if you are fertilizing. Turf Tech spring cleanup will begin on or about **April 1st.**

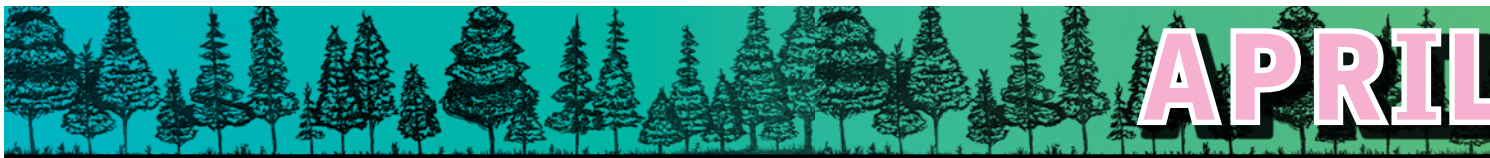
LEAF & BRUSH PICKUP SCHEDULE

Easy Easter Bunny Pots



The perfect budget friendly Easter craft that works as a handmade gift or place setting for your Easter table!

Materials Needed

- Small pots
- Fake greenery or green felt/paper (a great last minute alternative - simply cut your felt/paper to look like grass at the top)
- Small and large pom poms
- A hot glue gun (you can also use craft glue - you'll just need to hold it together to stick it)
- Felt for the feet (you can use two colours of felt to make the feet and paw prints - or you can paint on the paws)
- Easter eggs or Easter treats to put inside



Instructions

First you'll want to cut two feet out of felt. I freehanded these, making these just a bit smaller than the pom pom "bottom".

Next, add paw prints to one side of your bunny feet. You could do these by glueing on smaller pieces of felt - but I find the easiest way is to paint them on. I added one big paw pad and four little bunny toes to each foot.

Next you'll want to heat your hot glue gun up and get your pom poms ready. I used a small and large pom pom in the same colour to make my bunnies - but you could mix it up and use different colours.

Add some glue to the bottom of your small "tail" pom pom and attach it to your larger pom pom, pressing them together to ensure they stick.

Once your bunny bottoms are stuck together, start getting your greenery ready. Mine came in small bunches which I cut into smaller pieces and glued to the inside of my pot. You want to arrange your greenery towards the back of the pot so you have plenty of room to add your Easter eggs or treats!

Once you've got your greenery in, it's time to add your bunny! Add some glue to the front of your pot, ready to add your bunny.

Carefully attach your bunny "bottom" to the front of your pot, ensuring your tail is in the right place. You want it to look like the bunny is head down in the pot with it's bottom sticking up so the tail should be at the top.

Next, attach your feet by adding some glue to the other side of your felt feet and attaching them to the pom pom (that is, the side without your little paw prints). You want the feet to hang over the edge of the pot as shown in the photo.

Once your feet are on and your glue has set, it's time to add your treats! We filled our pots with chocolate Easter eggs, being careful not to knock off our little bunny!

Once your pots are filled, it's time to gift! You could gift these as is, or wrap each one in some cellophane, tying them with ribbon and adding a gift tag. These bunny pots would also make the perfect placecard holders for your Easter table. Why not add a little mini "garden stake" to the top of the pot with each person's name. Simply get a skewer or toothpick, cut it to size and add some paper or washi tape to make a banner to add each person's name.

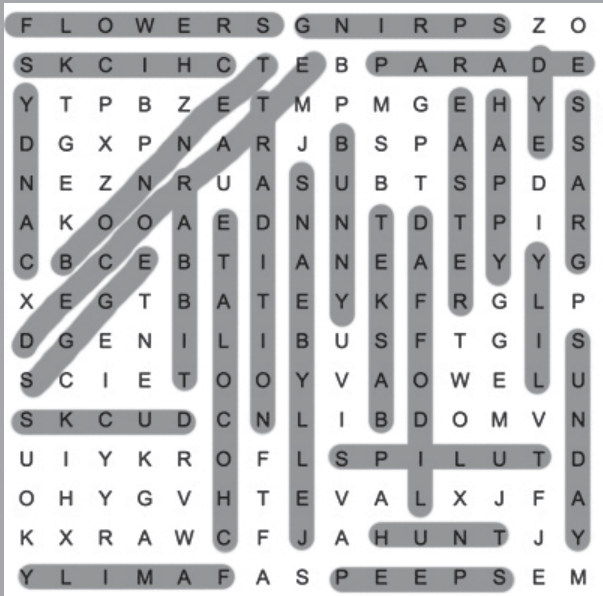

KIRMS PHOTOGRAPHY Indoor Sports

This month, I'd like to talk about indoor sports photography. It's much the same as outdoor photography, but the lighting can be very difficult.

Knowledge of the sport will greatly increase your chances of capturing an action shot. Since many sports are fast-moving, try to anticipate the action and click the shutter button just before the moment you want to capture.

Using a zoom lens will allow you to get closer to the action. You will need to increase the ISO (speed setting) on your camera to get a fast enough shutter speed to stop the action. If your camera has icons for different shooting situations, put it on the sports icon. It generally looks like a runner (see green icon above). I recommend a shutter speed of 1/400 second or faster if the lighting allows.

Keep shooting after the peak of the action, and you may capture some great expressions on the athletes' faces. Always set your camera to burst mode to capture multiple consecutive images.
