Warm Sunny Greetings!

Our financial results for the month of May are in.

Our total income for the month of May was \$191,181. This is higher than the budgeted amount by \$3,567. This is a result of higher than budgeted work order income by \$1,275, and a \$1,443 Credit Card Cash Back Reward.

Operating Expenses were \$156,498. This is lower than the budget by \$11,403. This is a result of lower than budgeted costs for Insurance and Bus Services.

Net income for the month is \$683.

We have added \$34,000 to our reserves in May leaving us with a balance in our reserve account of \$847,798. I am still optimistic that we will reach our goal of \$1,000,000 in our reserves at year-end.

We are always striving to make Crestwood 6 a pleasant, safe, and happy place to live. Help us by attending our events and supporting our clubs and activities!

SENIOR FREEZE

NJ residents born before 1960 or permanently disabled residents receiving Social Security or Railroad Retirement disability payments as of 12/31/25 may be eligible if:

- You owned and lived in your home (or leased a site in a mobile home park and lived in your mobile home) in 2022 and through December 31, 2025;
- Your property was subject to property taxes (site fees); and
- You meet the 2024 and 2025 income limits:
 - 2024 — \$168,268 or less
 - 2025 — \$172,475 or less

ANCHOR

Affordable NJ Communities for Homeowners & Renters

Property Tax Relief For:

- Homeowners Earning \$250K or Less
- Renters Earning \$150K or Less

Stay NJ

For Senior Homeowners

- Age 65 or over in 2025
- 2025 income below \$500,000
- Owned and lived in your home for all of 2025

Stay NJ benefits are calculated after ANCHOR and Senior Freeze benefits are determined. If you qualify for all three programs, the Stay NJ benefit will be 50% of your property taxes (up to \$13,000) minus any payments received through ANCHOR and Senior Freeze (2025 benefit cap of \$6,500).

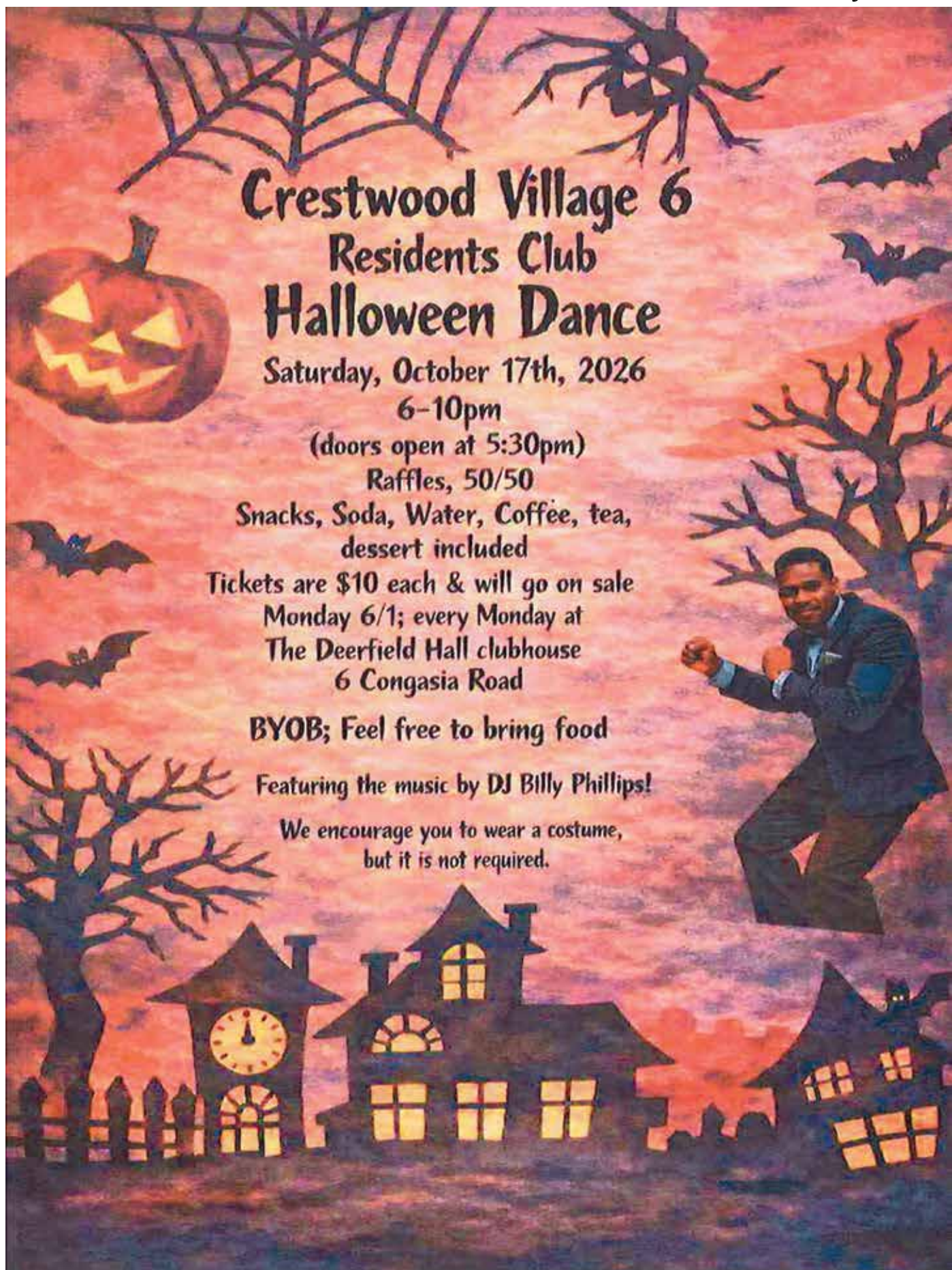

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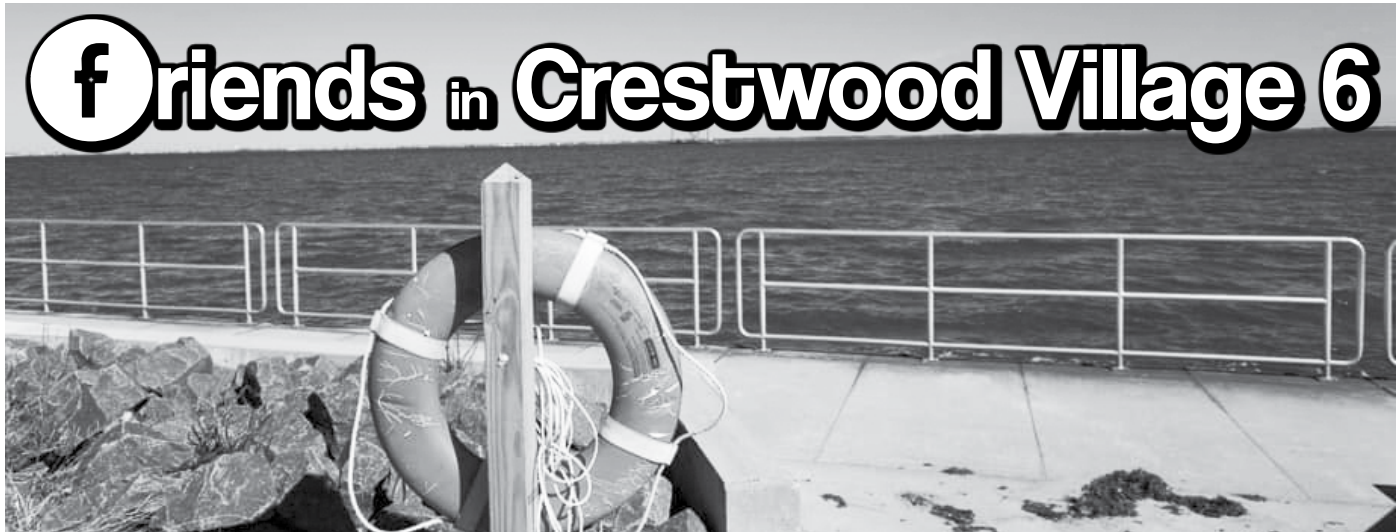

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LANDSCAPE LIGHTING

KIRMS PHOTOGRAPHY Sunrise And Sunset

Sunrise is getting later in the morning this time of year, so it's a great time to get our sunrise shots.

It is important to use the rule of thirds. Try not to put the sun in the middle of the frame. Place it toward the side. Having something in the foreground will strengthen your image.

If you want a silky look to the water, use a tripod and a long exposure. Sunrise images are much better with some clouds to reflect the sun's colors.

Check the monitor on the back of your camera to make certain the exposure is good. Your foreground

objects will generally be silhouetted but you want them not to be completely dark.

If you include people in the shot and you don't want them silhouetted use your flash to light them up.
